Mr. Apurva Chandra is a retired Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer with over 36 years of distinguished service in the Government of India and the Government of Maharashtra. He has held several key leadership positions, including Secretary in the Ministries of Health, Information & Broadcasting, and Labour; Director General (Acquisition) in the Ministry of Defence; Joint Secretary, Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas in Government of India and Principal Secretary (Industries) in the Government of Maharashtra. He has previously served on the boards of several major Public Sector Undertakings, including GAIL, Petronet LNG, MIDC and SICOM. His academic background includes a Bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering and a Master's degree in Structural Engineering from IIT Delhi. He also holds a Diploma in Business Finance from ICFAI (India).

Among his key achievements were the push for Ease of Doing Business for Industry, establishment of AURIC integrated industrial township at Chatrapati Sambhajinagar, finalisation of new labour Codes and Rules, streamlining natural gas allocation, initiating common carrier gas pipelines and rewriting the Defence Acquisition Procedure to focus on indigenisation.
